Marking the Test

In the preceding list of correct answers, the letter given next to each question number indicates the correct response to that specific question. Using a pen or pencil of a different color ink or lead from the one your child used, go through the test and circle the question number for each question your child has answered correctly. Remember, the child is allowed only one final answer to each question. In the event two answers have been marked for any single question, that question must be marked as having been answered incorrectly. After you have circled all the questions the child answered correctly, go back and count the number of questions you have circled as having been answered correctly in the group of questions designated as the questions to be answered for your child's age level. The total you get is your child's raw score.

Now, using the Raw Score to I.Q. Charts:

- 1. Pick out the correct table for your child's age.
- 2. In that table, find the row that indicates your child's age.
- 3. In that row, read across columns until you find the column with your child's raw score.
- 4. Read down to find the two numbers at the bottom. These show your child's percentile and approximate I.Q.

These tables were developed - or, technically, this test was "normed" - in the 1970s by giving it to public school students in suburban Cook County, Illinois. I.Q. tests work by comparing your child's raw score to the scores of other children, so in a sense, by using these charts, you are comparing your child to children who lived, thought, and learned 50 years ago. I.Q. tests do age and need to be "re-normed"; until this is done, please note that the I.Q. you just found may not be perfectly accurate.
